Florida State University is participating in a nationwide survey of college faculty members on the subject of academic dishonesty. The survey is designed to solicit instructor opinions about the current state of academic integrity at American institutions of higher education. It is similar in design to studies conducted over the last 20 years at more than 200 schools, involving more than 250,000 students and their instructors. Students are being surveyed separately.
