RE: Standard Meeting Time Update

With enrollment for Fall 2018 underway and 95% of the undergraduate Main Campus class schedule complete, now seems to be an appropriate time to review our efforts in improving the standardization of class meeting day and time patterns. As a reminder, in embracing patterns of standard meeting days and times in the scheduling of academic class sections, we can not only optimize the overall utilization of academic space at the University, but we can also directly impact the overall success of our students at the University by:

- Enabling students to create optimal academic class schedules, while maximizing their academic class schedule loads (Take15);
- Allowing students ample travel time to/from their academic classes;
- Presenting students with a more intuitive final exam schedule;
- Offering smaller academic class size options to students to help promote further student/faculty engagement;
- Reducing the number of potential academic class schedule conflicts for students, while increasing their chances of access into required/desired academic classes; and
- Providing students with greater opportunities for timely degree completion within four years.

Overall, our initial efforts to improve the use of standard meeting day and time patterns for undergraduate Main Campus classes have been positive – an increase of 8 percentage points (from 35% in Fall 2017 to 43% in Fall 2018) or a percentage increase of 23% – and represent a promising small step forward toward our goal of the nationwide standard time threshold of 70%.

Worthy of mention are some of the individual efforts being made at the College/School level, where some of your colleagues – Business, Criminology, Social Sciences, and Hospitality – have attained greater than 70% of standard meeting pattern usage for their undergraduate classes. Both overall and individually, such improvements demonstrate a commitment and dedication – which have not gone unnoticed – toward our goal of increasing the use of standard meeting patterns. Thank you for heeding the call to action and embarking on this ongoing mission with us to enhance this important facet of student success. I appreciate your continuing attention and cooperation with the adoption of standard meeting time scheduling and anticipate further improvements.
