
"This semester, I started off struggling in the class and I did think about dropping. I think it was beneficial that I was referred to this program and able to talk about the many ways I could help myself succeed."

WHAT FACULTY ARE SAYING



Through the PRE program, instructors can help students get additional academic assistance. With instructor referrals, PRE staff individually contact and work with students to address common barriers to student success.

- PRE sends faculty a reminder at first major assignment
- Faculty submit referrals online

Student communication

WEEKS 2-15

- Students contacted individually (email & phone)
- Email includes resources tailored to that class
- Student meetings or phone conversations occur
- Communication back with instructor as appropriate

Close the loop

WEEKS 15-16+

- PRE informs instructors of contact outcomes
- PRE conducts student satisfaction survey & focus groups
- PRE solicits instructor feedback
