- Information has also been provided to campus via websites including FSUAlerts and www.fsu.edu/coronavirus
- Regular scheduled briefings with Department of Health leadership, City and County Health and Administrative Officials, and other key stakeholders
- Regular communication with other education institutions both in and out of the state

- Starting last week we divided the emergency management committee into policy groups:

 - Danielle Acosta Director of Student Engagement
 - Research
 - Laurel Fulkerson Associate Vice President for Research

- Emergency management policy groups meet daily (including weekends) to discuss current issues and updates from their committees
- Executive Policy Group members (Vice President for Finance and Administration, Provost, and Vice President for Student Affairs) meet daily
- Plans are being fine tuned to manage any potential full or partial closure
- Faculty are encouraged to have plans finalized by March
 23 for alternative modes of course delivery
- Weekly Emergency Management conference calls are scheduled with departments who have lead or support roles in our plan

Current Status

- Canceled Florence Study Abroad International Program
- Notified future study abroad international program participants (including summer) final determination would be made regarding on ground operations by the end of March 2020

programs

Canceled all Study Abroad Spring Break international

- Restricted travel to any level 2 or level 3 country
- Require a self isolation period to any individual who visits a level 2 or level 3 country or cruise
- Voluntary self isolation period to any individual who visits a highly impacted area
- Suspended international travel and require appropriate Vice President's signature in order to approve

- Discontinued visiting scholar program canceled student visits, delayed future invitations, working with faculty to determine if they still want to move forward with previously scheduled visits (5)
- Special ordered additional toilet tissue, paper towels, hand soap, gloves, cleaners, disinfectants, wipes, hand sanitizer, etc.
- Developed posters regarding hand washing, self isolation vs. quarantine, symptoms, and more
- Purchased flu shots and made them available to campus
- Mandated the use of Concur for all travel bookings so that we know where our travelers are at all times

- Provided guidance on faculty and staff leave issues
- Developed employee remote work essentials page https://its.fsu.edu/remote-work
- Working with Star Metro to nightly disinfect all buses
- Ramping up cleaning efforts across campus in public spaces, high traffic areas, handrails/doors, etc.
- Developing plans to be able to answer large call volume remotely (call centers)

- Communicated with students and parents on self isolation and self quarantine and the necessity for them to develop a plan
- Preparing for parent pickup if necessary
- Preparing for online class conversion (if necessary),
 training on Canvas, addressing plans/policies, etc.
- Ordered appropriate supplies for healthcare workers
- Fine tuned plans for the Health Center

- Reviewing plans and policies for major events
- Developed a Special Events Annex from the CDC guidance on large gatherings for use by Athletics, Rec and Tucker Center
- Identify potential ways research could be disrupted the least
- Fine tuning plans to process payroll remotely
- Faculty, staff and students who no longer feel comfortable traveling can work with the Travel Office to cancel plans and seek reimbursements

What can you do to assist

- Reassure your students, faculty, and staff the University has very robust plans to assist in these types of dynamic situations
- Finalize plans for alternative delivery of course content
- Ensure your department has the appropriate educational materials
- Encourage students and colleagues to visit the University's website and FAQ's at www.fsu.edu/coronavirus
- Reiterate the University has plans to remain open to the extent possible, even if course content has to be delivered in alternate methods
- Be aware of faculty and staff travel plans and ensure self isolation when required
- Encourage students and colleagues to get their flu shot 13
