PROMOTING ACADEMIC INTEGRITY



As faculty, you are well aware that academic dishonesty is a symptom, not the root cause. Here are some "ounce of prevention" resources to help your students succeed in the classroom:

ACADEMIC CENTER FOR EXCELLENCE (ACE) & FSU LIBRARIES

ACE and FSU Libraries support students' success through a myriad of services including subject-specific tutoring, study rooms, topical workshops (e.g., time management), and student-oriented handouts/resources (e.g., citation help). THE READING WRITING CENTER

Just as we have all experienced writer's block, so do your students! Let them know that The Reading Writing Center is available to help them conceptualize their essay ideas and to foster their written communication competencies.



3 OFFICE OF ACCESSIBILITY SERVICES

Although this resource is included in your syllabi, consider verbally sharing early on how the Office of Accessibility Services offers help like exam time extensions, peer note taking, and more for those with documented disabilities.



CENTER FOR HEALTH ADVOCACY & WELLNESS (CHAW)

Having been students yourselves, you realize how personal concerns influence professional performance. Help students get ahead of the curve by partnering with CHAW to tackle a host of wellness topics: Nutrition, finances, romance, substance use, and more.



5 THE CAREER CENTER

Having a well defined career goal can help students to sustain their motivation. Encourage them visit to The Career Center! The department offers everything from drop-in career advising, individual career counseling, and the for-credit course SDS 3340: Introduction to Career Development.



6 <u>UNIVERSITY COUNSELING CENTER (UCC)</u>

A confidential place to explore identity formation, learn tailored problem-solving strategies, and address mental health hurdles can mitigate behaviors like academic dishonesty. Make sure students know that such a resource exists through the UCC.



7 <u>CASE MANAGEMENT</u> & VICTIM ADVOCATE PROGRAM

Life presents unexpected hurdles, and knowing the best way to get help is not always clear. Case Management's supportive referral service was created specifically for this purpose. Additionally, Victim Advocate Program is a confidential service for those who believe they have been the victim of a crime.
