Testing Center Fall 2023 Services

The Office of Distance Learning is pleased to announce the soft reopening of the main campus FSU Testing Center for Fall 2023 course exams. Service capacity is limited until the center is fully staffed by Spring 2024. Instructors may now submit a request for Fall testing services (instructions below). Priority scheduling will be given to distance learning and highenrollment face-to-face courses.

What do I tell students?

Make sure students are aware of the latest proctored testing procedures and policies: <u>Update</u> your Canvas course site(s) with the newly revised proctored exams syllabus block or copy and paste our recommended text on your course syllabus page.

Is Honorlock online proctoring available?

The Honorlock contract runs through the last week of Fall classes and is available for use in distance learning courses and those in which it is the most effective option (see March announcement). Honorlock will not be available for Fall final exams. Instructors are encouraged to take advantage of in-class or other proctoring solutions that include in-class polling, lockdown browsers, Scantron services, the FSU Testing Center, or other third-party solutions. The university is procuring a new agreement for online proctoring that will best support distance learners after the current contract ends. More information will be available later in the Fall semester.

- Please note that courses using Honorlock are not eligible for exam proctoring in the FSU Testing Center.
- Don't forget to remove Honorlock-related instructions and syllabus blocks from your Canvas course sites if you are no longer using this service.
